A blood chemistry and CBC (Complete Blood Count) assist your veterinarian in diagnosing and treating any conditions found before they can become clinical. As a senior pet, your pet will be experiencing changes as they age. Special screenings have been included in their semi-annual wellness exam in order to explore issues common to our senior pets. Again, early detection usually equals better health and comfort for your senior pet.
