In them, they look from nose to tail, looking for any issues your cat may have. Catching and treating most issues early can either help to cure them completely or manage them successfully, making your cat healthier and more comfortable throughout his or her life. A blood chemistry and CBC (Complete Blood County) assist your veterinary in diagnosing and treating any conditions found before they can become clinical. As a senior pet, your cat will be experiencing changes as they age. Special screenings have been included in their semi-annual wellness exam in order to explore issues common to our senior felines. Again, early detection usually equals better health and comfort for your senior companion.
